*Bote, Der*, 1924 - : originally published by Mennonitisches Immigrantenkomitee but considered an official organ of the Conference. Bound, indexed. MHCA, reference shelf.

*Bulletin*, Conference of Mennonites in Canada, Winnipeg, 1965–1971: four to six times annually; 1972–1988: annually; bound. (See also *Report* and *Workbook*) [Conference news, annual reports of boards and committees, and major issues for the next annual sessions.]

*CMC Directory*, 1996–1999, annual. [Statistical information on congregations and directory of Conference commissions and committees.]

*CMC Insert in Mennonite Reporter*, beginning about 1979, variable frequency.

*CMC Minute Book*, 1996–1999: annual. [Minutes of the annual conference sessions.]

*Conference Highlights*. Winnipeg, 1960–1963: irregular; bound. [Predecessor to *Bulletin*; companion booklet to the annual *Yearbook*.]

*Intotemak*, 1980– : bimonthly, then quarterly; bound. [Successor to *Totemak*; see below.]

*Jahrbuch der Konferenz der Mennoniten in Canada*, 1928–1964: annual, bound. [Agenda, reports, papers, conference sermon, and minutes of annual sessions. Congregational statistics since 1931. See also *Yearbook*.]

*Mennonite Historian*, History-Archives Committee of the Conference of Mennonites in Canada, Winnipeg, 1975 - : quarterly, volume 1-12 (1975–1986) bound with Index. Since 1987 published jointly with the Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies, Winnipeg.

*Mennonite Pioneer Mission Quarterly*. Altona, 1945–1961: bound. [Initially MPM, forerunner of Native Ministries, was the mission board of the Bergthaler Mennonite Church of Manitoba; transfer to the CMC was completed in 1960.]

*Report*, Conference of Mennonites in Canada, Winnipeg, 1989–1998: annual, bound. [Annual pre-conference reports of boards and committees published prior to annual sessions. See also *Workbook*.]

*Totemak*, 1972–1979: variable, then bi-monthly; bound. [Periodical of Mennonite Pioneer Mission board, later Native Ministries Board. See also *Intotemak*.]

*Yearbook*, Conference of Mennonites in Canada: 1965–1995: annual, bound. [Successor to *Jahrbuch der Konferenz der Mennoniten in Kanada*. See also *CMC Minute Book* and *CMC Directory*.]

*Workbook*, 1999, annual. [Successor to *Report*.]

*Young People's Messenger*, 1947–1950: quarterly, bound.
